About Trent Education Centre

Trent Education Centre (TEC) has offered functional skills and vocational training to adults in Nottingham, Leicester, and Birmingham since 2012. Many of our students feel they have missed their chance to study. Some left school recently, and others left many years ago. They may not feel confident or may think they do not have the skills for university. TEC supports these students by helping them build confidence, develop new skills, and prepare for study at university level and for future careers.

Mission – to provide students in local communities with the holistic education they need to enhance their life chances.

Vision – to become a leading provider of lifelong learning, supporting adults from basic skills and further education through to higher education and sustained career success.

Since 2012, TEC has helped adults grow through learning. We believe it is never too late to improve your skills, gain confidence, and reach your goals. By supporting students to develop their abilities and ambitions, we help them move towards university-level study and long-term career success.

Many of our students finish their functional skills or vocational courses and want to continue into higher education. TEC has now started to offer higher education courses. We also plan to register with the Office for Students as an approved provider. When this happens, eligible students may be able to apply for Student Loan Funding for our higher education courses.

English Courses at Trent Education Centre (TEC)

TEC currently offers two English language courses in our **Castle Boulevard Campus in Nottingham**. The following provides a brief overview. See the next section below for more details about the content of each course.

Ascentis ESOL Courses (Entry 1 to Level 2)

What This Course Is

The Ascentis ESOL Certificate helps you improve your **Speaking and Listening, Reading and Writing**.

The course follows the **Adult ESOL Core Curriculum** used across the UK.

You study three units:

- Speaking & Listening Communication
- Reading
- Writing

Your teachers assess your work, and Ascentis checks the results.

Who the Course Is For

This course is for adults aged 18+ who live in the UK and want to improve their English. It is suitable for:

- people from settled communities
- refugees and asylum seekers
- anyone who speaks another language at home

What You Will Learn

You will learn English to help you:

- use English at work
- speak confidently in daily life
- understand services in the UK
- travel, study and socialise more easily

ESOL Levels

We offer five levels:

Class Times and Study Hours

You study **2 days per week, 4 hours per day**.
You will be told your study days when you apply.

Each unit includes:

- **Speaking & Listening** – 15 weeks (120 hours)
- **Reading** – 6 weeks (60 hours)
- **Writing** – 9 weeks (90 hours)

Total study time: **30 weeks, 270 hours**

NCFE Functional Skills English (Level 1 and Level 2)

About the Course

Functional Skills English helps you use English in **real-life situations**.
It is useful for work, apprenticeships and further study.
You study:

- Speaking, Listening and Communicating
- Reading
- Writing

Levels

Level	Equivalent	What It Means
Level 1	GCSE grades 1–3	You can use English independently in familiar situations
Level 2	GCSE grade 4	The level needed for many jobs, colleges and universities

Class Times and Study Hours

You study **2 days per week, 5 hours per day**.
Total study time: **60 hours over 6 weeks**.

Our Location

Trent Education Centre has several locations in Leicester, Birmingham, and Nottingham, all close to the city centres. The NCFE Functional Skills and Ascentis ESOL classes take place at the Castle Boulevard campus in Nottingham. This campus is next to Castle Rock, one of Nottingham's most famous landmarks, made of sandstone that is around 250 million years old.

Nottingham is a great place to study. It has a lively student community, strong universities, and many international restaurants, busy bars, and social activities.

All our campuses are friendly and have modern classrooms with everything students need. Our staff are always available to guide you and help with any questions.

Our Campus Facilities

Trent Education Centre wants every student to feel safe, supported, and comfortable on campus. Our facilities include a kitchen area with free tea and coffee, plus a fridge and microwave, so you can relax and take a break during the day. There is also a comfortable lounge where you can talk with other students, make friends, and practise your English in a friendly environment during breaks and lunchtime.

Our library has many useful English language and Functional Skills books and resources. It also has a quiet study area where you can focus on your work. We also provide modern IT stations that help you improve your digital skills, complete your coursework, and build confidence with technology in a supportive space.

Library Services

As a TEC student, you can use our library freely. It has all the books you need for your course, as well as many extra books to help you improve your skills and support your learning.

You will receive a full library induction at the start of your course. Your teacher will also help you find any information you need. Your course reading list will be on Moodle, and all required books will be available in the college library.

Study Support

The Study Support Team is always ready to help you build your study skills and make your learning experience stronger. We offer one-to-one support meetings and workshops where teachers can help you understand your course and your feedback more clearly. If you feel you need extra support with any skills, please speak to your teacher so we can help you.

English Language Support

For students who do not speak English as their first language, or who find reading, writing, or listening difficult, we offer one-to-one support and workshops to help you improve your English skills. Assessments and Feedback

Assessments for ESOL students are used to help you develop your English skills and make progress in your learning. You will take part in different classroom activities, such as speaking and listening tasks, role plays, writing and reading activities, quizzes, and interactive digital tasks like Kahoot and Padlet. All these activities are practical, enjoyable, and linked to real-life skills.

Feedback is very important for your learning. You will receive feedback regularly, both in writing and through spoken comments. Teachers may also arrange one-to-one meetings or workshops to help you understand your progress. At TEC, we believe that clear and timely feedback helps you show what you know, think more deeply, and take responsibility for your own learning. This helps you reflect on your progress and develop skills that will support you throughout your life.

The aim of our assessment is to help you become confident, independent, and able to communicate well in English.

Personal Tutors

As a student at Trent Education College, you will have a personal tutor to support you. Your personal tutor is a member of the academic staff who will help you throughout your studies through one-to-one meetings and workshops. They will send you a welcome email when you join the course. It is a good idea to meet with your personal tutor regularly, as this will help you do better in your studies.

Programme Leader

The course programme leader is responsible for the content and delivery of your course. They can help you with any problems you have during your studies, such as difficulty completing tasks or meeting submission deadlines. Student Code Of Conduct

TEC aims to give every student a safe, positive, and respectful experience. Everyone is treated equally, and we value difference and diversity. All staff, students, and visitors have the right to study and work in an environment where they feel safe and respected.

The Student Code of Conduct explains the behaviour we expect from all students. It makes clear what is acceptable and what is not, and it also explains what may happen if these expectations are not met.

Behaviour

Everyone at the college must be treated with respect. This follows our Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Policy, which protects people from discrimination based on sex, gender, race, religion, marital status, beliefs, and other characteristics. Any abusive behaviour, whether face-to-face or online, is not allowed at any time.

Care of property

All TEC property and equipment must be used carefully and respectfully. Eating and drinking are not allowed during lessons. Students should use the designated kitchen area for food and drinks.

Smoking and vaping

Smoking and vaping are not allowed anywhere on campus, including toilets, corridors, and entrances. Please follow all No Smoking signs around the building.

Discipline

Disciplinary procedures will be taken if a student has breached the Student Code of Conduct, examples of which may include the following:

- Abusive behaviour, verbal or physical, which causes distress or fear
- Sexual harassment or violence
- Racist behaviour
- Damage to college property

- Disruption in class which may affect teaching or examination
